Jacob and Esau

Memory Verse: Let us love one another (1 John 4:7)

The theme this month is on sharing God's love others. especially to our o w n family members Particularly, the focus is on the relationship between the Bible characters, Jacob and Esau, brothers who constantly compete with each other for their

father's favour, but eventually learn to accept each other just as God accepts and forgives us despite our wrongdoings.

Lesson 1 (Genesis 25:19-28)

conceiving, prayed to the Lord to bless them with children. God was gracious and answered their prayer by giving them twin boys, Jacob and Esau, in spite of their old to our family without favouritism. age.



Though they were twins. Jacob and Esau had neither similar physical attributes nor character. Isaac and Esau shared similar interests in the outdoors and hunting, Isaac loved Esau more, while Rebekah favoured Jacob. Thus the seed of sibling rivalry was unconsciously planted by the twins' parents, bringing about strong and

unhealthy competition between the twins as they grew up. As parents, we need to remind ourselves to refrain from practising favouritism towards our children, as it may Isaac and Rebekah, who had difficulties bring about undesirable outcomes from them. Just as God is just and impartial to us, loving us regardless of how different we are from one another, let us also show love

Lesson 2 (Genesis 25:27-34)

Jacob and Esau continued their rivalry as they grew up. In this account, Jacob demanded Esau to sell his birthright to him in exchange for a meal. Esau, who was famished, agreed to the exchange, but subsequently resented Jacob for robbing him of his



understand how an exchange system works even at a very young age, but they need to be taught that they can actually give up or do something for others without seeking for anything in return. Essentially, this is how children learn to share and help one another. They need to understand that genuine kindness, care or concern for others is unconditional, and the intangible reward from doing so is the joy derived from others' appreciation of their efforts. Most importantly, when we do kind acts unconditionally, they experience God's unconditional love for us.

Lesson 3 (Genesis 27:1-45)

Rebekah conspired with Jacob to rob Esau of his blessings as Isaac laid on his death bed. Upon discovery of their schemes, Esau was extremely furious and even promised to kill Jacob, which led to Jacob fleeing out of



fear for his life.

Dishonesty and lies, regardless of their magnitude, separates us from the holiness of God. As Christians, we aim to live our lives in such a way that others will desire to know God through His work in us, how He changes and moulds us to be like Him. May we also be able to raise our children up to live their lives in this manner, showing others God's love through their honesty and obedience.

Lesson 4 (Genesis 32:3-21, 33:1-11)

Jacob had prospered in his years of hiding from Esau. Upon instructions from God, he headed back home, even though he was terrified that Esau would carry out his threat and kill him for robbing him of his blessings. When they finally met, Esau welcomed Jacob and forgave him of all his wrongdoings.



When we love a person with God's love, we should be willing to forgive him regardless of his wrongdoings, just as God forgave us of all our sins. Let us teach our children about forgiveness whenever an opportunity presents itself: at home while playing with their siblings, or when they interact with others in school, or at the park. Teach them the simple words of forgiveness so that others may come to know of God's love and graciousness through them.
